Please note that you should not submit this paper copy: it is only to help you make sure that you have all the information that you need before you start entering data on-line.

Overview of Registration Process

- Step 1 Print and complete draft of registration form (this is the form on the following pages. Have your teacher or sponsor review the form once it is completed.
- Step 2 Print and complete required scientific review forms. Junior projects use one set of forms, intermediate and senior another. Flowcharts posted on the registration page will help you determine which forms in the set you need to fill out. Some of these forms need to be completed *before your start your experimentation*.
- Step 3 Complete the official on-line registration form. The form will be available from noon on Monday, January 28^h to noon on Friday, March 7th.
- Step 4 Print *Record of Registration*.
- Step 5 Print and complete approval form.
- Step 6 Return signed scientific-review and permission forms by mail.
- Step 7 Print your to-do checklist.
- Step 8 Print and complete safety checklist.
- Step 9 Optional: make changes/corrections to registration form. You can make changes to your registration until March 5th.

² Pronunciation

Here are some examples of how you might suggest pronunciation of your name. Hyphens mark divisions between syllables and capitalization indicates a stressed syllable. Use the actual spelling of everyday words where you can. Don't worry about giving phonetic spellings for names like Bob, Mary, Smith or Chan; we can figure those ones out on our own.

| Kasia Jankowska | Kasha Yan-KOV-ska |

If you are have any trouble coming up with a suggested pronunciation, ask your teacher for help.
